# **Constitution Building for Democracy**

21 – 25 November 2011 in Barcelona, Spain

## Introduction

Constitutions do much more than establish government and regulate its relationship to citizens – for many states, they have become tools to manage crisis and conflict, build inclusive democracies and lay the foundation for a culture of human rights. Constitution building is a political process aimed at addressing the challenges that modern democracies are facing.

Constitutional reform has thus become a characteristic part of intrastate conflict resolution, peace building, democratic reform and equitable economic development. National stakeholders and international professionals who work in these fields must have a competent understanding of the process of constitution building, the challenges and constraints during these processes as well as the realistic opportunities for political and social transformation. This course will address what kind of practices will help citizens, leaders and their supporters build democratic, sustainable constitutions.

#### **Overview**

This five day course on *Constitution building for democracy* is aimed at professionals interested in developing their knowledge on how constitution building practices influence the protection of political and other rights and liberties as a means to building democracies that resolve conflicts peacefully. The workshop will follow an experience-based and interactive learning format.

The core workshop will revolve around norms, comparative practices and problem solving supported by resource materials from Constitution Building Training Programme:

- ✓ Module on constitution building practices and mechanisms
- Module on constitution building for a human rights culture

# **Objectives**

Participants of the training will be able to:

- Improve their understanding of and engagement in constitution building processes
- Be able to identify viable constitution building practices that are suited in their own contexts or the contexts in which they work
- o Have broader options on how to bridge the sociological divisions on human rights issues
- Use constitution building to solve some of the challenges of building a sustainable democracy

# Training team

The focus of the training workshop is the experience of the individual participants. The use of comparative options that are practice-oriented will assist participants to explore specific issues that they confront in their own work. A team of experienced trainers will lead the course and facilitate interactive exercises, discussions and case study analysis.

To enrich discussions, provide feedback to participants and to ensure that technical aspects, especially from a legal perspective, are thoroughly addressed, the training team will be complemented by resource persons who are constitutional and human rights law experts.

# Who should participate?

The course on Constitution Building for Democracy is open to participants from around the world. Participants will have a variety of disciplinary backgrounds and skills. They will be individuals working in political and technical aspects of democratic reform and conflict management within a range of national and international institutions. Specifically, those with responsibilities within the following functions will benefit from attending the training:

- Advising on governance/democracy reforms
- ✓ Advocacy/promotion of human rights
- ✓ Briefing officials/politicians on constitutions
- ✓ Conflict mediation support
- ✓ Civic education on constitutions

- ✓ Implementing constitutional reform
- ✓ Legislating/law making/legal reform
- ✓ Monitoring democratic practices
- ✓ Policy making/implementation
- ✓ Technical assistance for governance reform

The course is limited to 26 participants.

### Travel & accommodation

The organizers will provide economy class return air tickets and full board accommodation for participants. There is no course fee.

# **Application**

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis.

Please note that for most participants who do not hold an EU passport, it will be necessary to apply for a Schengan visa to enter Spain. It will take up to <u>four weeks</u> for the visa to be granted. Therefore it is recommended that if you hold a passport which requires you to obtain a visa, to submit your applications materials as soon as possible.

# Venue & Organizers

The training will be held at the Barcelona International Peace Resource Center (BIPCR) in the Castell de Montjuïc or Montjuïc Castle, a municipal facility located on a rocky terrace by the coast, rising to a height of 192 meters above sea level.

The Peace Center aims at contributing to the transformation of a former military prison and military museum into an active international peace space, through a highly specialized training program addressed to professionals active in international peace and humanitarian relief missions.
